## **SUMMER READING: ELEMENTS OF A STORY - PROJECT GUIDELINES**

In order to demonstrate your understanding of your summer reading text, you will complete the Summer Reading Elements of a Story Project. This project will assess your understanding of the elements of a story and character development. The completed product will be a mini-poster displaying your analysis.

WHAT TO DO? (YOU HAVE ALREADY DONE THIS WORK! NOW, WE ARE JUST FINALIZING IT!)

- 1. First, identify the setting, both the physical and social/historical, of your text.
- 2. Then, identify the protagonist of your text.
- 3. Then, identify the main conflict, both the type and specific conflict.
- 4. After, identify the plot points of your text, deciding on the exposition, the 5-7 most critical rising actions, the climax, the 3-4 most critical falling actions, and the resolution.
- 5. Then, analyze the character development of your protagonist, identifying the initial characterization, 2-3 transitional characterizations, and the final characterization.
- 6. Finally, identify the theme of your text.

Once you have identified and selected the necessary content for your project, you will create a plot diagram for your text. Unlike a traditional plot diagram, this one must connect to an important idea, theme, symbol, etc. present in your text. (Example: For *Beauty and the Beast*, a plot diagram that connects to an important symbol of the text is a rose vine or a book progressively opening.) While the plot points must be positioned on the plot diagram, you may format the rest of the poster's content however you feel is best!
